

The Bistrită river

The Bistrită River (283 Km length) is one of the main tributaries of the Siret River, which is the second affluent at the Danube River in terms of discharge and basin surface. The Bistrită River has an area of 4239 km^2 and contribution to the Siret discharge represents more than 30% ($66 \text{ m}^3/\text{s}$). The mean altitude of the basin is 91m. The Bistrită River has a population about 550 000 inhabitants, from which some 55% live in urban areas.

The upper reach of the river, upstream of the junction with the Bârgău River in the village of Prendu Bârgăului is under protection locally as Bistrițean Rivers.

The following towns and villages are situated along the river Bistrită, from source to mouth: Cobârte, Bistrită Bârgăului, Prendu Bârgăului, Liveni, Bistrită

But somebody must love NATURE. Somebody must protect it!




